“Here they pulled up in a sheriff's car and I wondered dear God what have I done now but instead of being the bearer of bad news they held out a check that would assist in making certain there was a marker on my daughter's grave. I can't help but want to make sure another family receives the same thing in tragic times. Nothing can take away the pain but being able to mark your daughter's grave – well this is my way of trying to say thank you.” said Tallman. “I want to be a part of helping the Blue Knights achieve their goals. I might be just a drop in the hat of many who help but every bit counts when it comes to those on the receiving end. This stop on the tour kicks off a continual donation process where for every book I sell on the road will have proceeds going to the Blue Knights, not to mention a tall standing old mason jar old Cecil (a character from The All-Soul's Faire) might have once drank his shine from available to drop some change into.” said Tallman.

It is expected that Mitchell Harris, President of the chapter XVII and an Investigator for Dinwiddie County Sheriff's Office will be in attendance and Tallman hopes that many more of their members will drop in to be a part of the day's celebration for art, writing, friendships, and mostly for the love of a dearly missed child that was taken far too soon not only from her parents arms but from the art world in general.

Mitchell Harris, President of the chapter XVII and an Investigator for Dinwiddie County Sheriff's Office commented, “When we heard of Ms. Tallman's loss, it affected us deeply. As Law Enforcement Officers, we witness pain and suffering on an all too frequent basis. When Blue Knights Motorcycle Club Chapter Virginia XVII had the opportunity to help Kristy out in a small way we were eager to assist. That's one small way we can “give back” to the people we serve. Her offer of a donation of the proceeds came as a complete surprise to me and the rest of the Chapter. We truly appreciate this unique opportunity which allows us to continue our goal of providing help to families who could use assistance in a time of need.”
